PA DISTRICT EDUCATOR



Hi everyone

The time has finally arrived to start the riding season and we have a lot of preparation that needs to be done before we go on that first ride.

As I have mentioned before, we need to start refreshing our riding skills at the start of the season, and we should also refresh our skills in GROUP RIDING.

As you are all aware, we should ride in a staggered position with the leader assuming the left position and others staggered behind him.

The group leader must watch his speed, because the larger the group, the faster the last bike will have to travel keep up with the group.

The recommended size for a group is five to six bikes. More than six bikes you should break up into two groups with approximately 5 minutes between the groups.

When you arrive to go on a group ride make sure you have a full tank of gas and an empty bladder.

Communications between the leader and the last bike in the group are essential and conversations by others in the group should be kept to a minimum. If you have persons riding in the group without a radio they should be placed between two bikes with radios.

When riding in an area with stop lights, stop or yield signs, or heavy traffic, the group may get separated. When this happens, the last bike should communicate with the leader so he can slow the group down until the separated bikes can catch up, or if necessary find a spot to pull over and wait on the rest of the group.

The last thing to keep in mind is that on all rides we need to be considerate of each other and plan frequent rest stops and/or bathroom stops especially in warm weather when everyone should be drinking plenty of liquids to keep from becoming dehydrated.

We should also plan our meal stops for those who need to eat on a regular basis.

As we look forward to another great season of riding we should keep the above things in mind as we plan our rides and everyone will have a great time and enjoy the rides even more.

Responsibilities of a Leader

Each of us as leaders are responsible for the areas that we lead. The Chapter Director for their Chapter, the District Director for the District, and TEAM GWRRA is responsible for all areas. I have often said that the customer of TEAM GWRRA are the Districts, the Districts are the Chapters, and the Chapter our Membership, even though at every level we serve the Membership.

A governing document for all Officers of GWRRA is the MOU, Memorandum of Understanding. If you are looking for your "must do's" in GWRRA, that is where you'd find it.

Underlying all of our leadership at all levels is the Member. The challenge for all of us is communicating with the Membership. A Member who participates in GWRRA finds a bond and creates an emotional attachment. We build friendships.

So how do we best communicate with all of our Members? That has always been the question. GWRRA has Wing World magazine, Insight, email blasts, several websites, Wing Ding newsletter, FaceBook, Twitter, Instagram and so forth. You would think with all of these vehicles we would have the communication situation under control. Well, it's a good start. We rely on the Districts to communicate with the Chapter leadership with updates from TEAM GWRRA and GWRRA. The Chapters are the closest to our Members so their newsletters and other forms of communication are critical. Make certain that your content is up to date. Your list of Officers is correct from TEAM GWRRA right on down (TEAM GWRRA roster was in last month's Insight).

We are introducing another ability for our Leadership to communicate a bit more easily with their Members. You will be able to update their information quicker, as GWRRA relies on the Member to call or write in to update their information. It is a secure platform for GWRRA. By the end of April we should have all Districts on the platform, so stay tuned so you can get involved. The great news is, it's easy and it's free.

My question to you as a Leader is, who it is that you communicate with? We have Membership who are involved and passionate. These Members are easy to communicate with. This represents about 30% of our Membership. That leaves 70% of our Membership for us to communicate with. You can email your newsletter to all email addresses on your ARL. You can have a phone tree team or take all of your Team and divide up the ARL and make a more personal phone call. This new platform will let us easily reach out to all.

Those in that 70% group are there for many reasons. Some is distance to the nearest Chapter; availability of their time; don't like the Chapter closest to them; would rather just go for a ride; they don't have time for all the activities of Chapter Life and so forth. On some of the calls or conversations I've had, they just want the Gold Book, Wing World magazine, and the other benefits. But many just haven't felt welcomed by the Chapter in that first encounter, and they never went back.

Our ongoing challenge is to talk with these Members as well. So what do they want to do? What can you do to get them involved? That starts with a conversation of introduction and getting to know how they would like to interact with you. Start by inviting them to a ride. We are different on a ride. We talk about

the ride, the bike, the trip, and the twisty. It's not as social until, if it's included, we have a meal. But even then, we have more of an active conversation and it's bike centered. This is how we can connect with a fellow biker. And being invited to a ride may not be as intimidating as walking into a room of strangers. I challenge you to start reaching out and having a conversation with those on the ARL. Now it is true that many won't answer their phone if they don't recognize the number. You can help that by sending an email that you will be calling and here is the number to expect, calling and leaving a great message, and there is also a text. A text message could be introducing yourself and letting them know that you left them a message and you'll call back on a specific date and time. We do have to be a bit more creative today than we used to. The new communications platform will help with that as well. I look forward to hearing from you as you start making these calls and hearing about your results.

New and Prospective Members

Just a quick reminder on those new and prospective Members that come out monthly on the ARL. The District is charged with making first contact with those folks; to invite them to an event after they have taken some time to talk with them to determine where they might fit best. BUT, Chapters, feel free to also make the call. Imagine if you were a new Member and both the District and a Chapter reached out to you.

The District must reach out as they are the ones that assign the new Member to a Chapter, District, or District Ride Group.

Those Prospective Members will have a designation by their name: T - 1 month temporary Member who has contacted GWRRA for a look at us; GB - from the Gold Book's 4 month free Membership; or DCM - 4 month Membership from a Dealer. We need to be certain these folks are contacted, invited to join us for some activities, and then encourage to continue with their Membership with GWRRA. We'll reach out to remind them from Home Office, but your encouragement will usually make a huge difference.

Who Can See the ARL and How Much Can They See?

I've had this question asked of me quite often. The answer is quite easy. A current Officer has signed an MOU and that MOU says they'll protect the Members' information and not share it, so any current Officer can see all of the information on an ARL.

What if they are not an Officer - have them sign a confidentially agreement (on OConnect) and they are good to go.

How much can they see? A District is free to send the entire District's ARL out to the Chapter Officers. In some cases, it's necessary for them to send a neighboring ARL as their Members are on the borders. This action is to make certain our Members stay connected, so let's make it as easy as possible for our Leadership Teams to get the information and make those contacts. Thanks!


