

#### PA DISTRICT EDUCATOR



#### Hi Everyone:

What's your favorite part about riding a motorcycle? Almost every rider will say the freedom that comes from getting out in the open air ranks high on their list-it's one of the essential parts of the riding experience that makes traveling the same road in a car and on a bike so much different.

But come wintertime that open air can serve up a big challenge for riders, too—keeping warm and dry. Wind and wet are both your enemies when it comes to staying warm.

Staying warm isn't just a matter of comfort. Cold riders risk hypothermia and riding when you're hypothermic can be as dangerous as riding drunk; lack of coordination, slurred speech, confusion, poor decision making and drowsiness are all symptoms.

So what to do about it? Luckily, most motorcycle clothing designed to provide abrasion protection is pretty good at providing wind protection as well.

Now what can your bike do to help?

#### Windshield:

Tucking in behind one not only makes it more comfortable to sit upright, but the better designs keep you sitting in a still-air pocket, both for comfort and warmth.

#### **Body Design:**

Again, the better touring designs keep the wind off your lower body and legs, helping keep you both warmer and drier.

#### **Heated Grips:**

Electrically heated grips let you wear gloves that are thin enough for good control feel without compromising warmth and comfort.

#### **Active Heat:**

Most Gold Wing models offer heating ducts that channel warm air over the rider's feet. Your car has a heater—why shouldn't your bike?

#### **Electric Clothing:**

You may have already purchased heated vests, jackets, gloves and chaps for your winter riding pleasure. In most cases your bike will have plenty of extra power available for these accessories.

In closing, the Gold Wing with its windshield, body design and heat-venting system are all state of the art, and there's plenty of extra power available for your heated clothing.

Remember, a warm rider is a Happy Rider. Also remember ATGATT.

#### To Zoom Or Not To Zoom - That Is The Question

Sherry and I get the feeling that in some cases there is a reluctance to take advantage of utilizing Zoom Video Conferencing. Yes, there are many ways to communicate with each other: email, text, phone, social media, etc. In our opinion, nothing is better than face-to-face where we build relationships and have an instant exchange of thoughts and viewpoints. Face-to-face just makes for better interaction.

So, why the reluctance? Many of our Members holding voluntary positions have at least a laptop with a built-in camera and microphone. Some who have desktops have an external camera/microphone and speakers. Most should have Internet access, although some may be too rural.

Since zoom.com is the application that can be downloaded for free, would not all volunteers want this? You get 40 free minutes to hold a call and when the call ends, you can log back on for additional time.

We find this tool to be invaluable and we participate in Zoom calls every month. That does not mean that as a Director you should hold them every month. Perhaps every other month or quarterly would work best for you. The point is, you should take advantage of this very powerful communication tool.

We bring this up because all too often we are hearing that communication is lacking, especially at the District Level. Some Chapter Directors feel that communication is lacking other than what they see in a District Newsletter or email.

If you need help setting up a Zoom account, we can get you that help.

We know that everyone has busy schedules and an entire Team may not be available for a particular call. That is fine. That will happen frequently. However, it is important to continue to build relationships with your Team as they will be on the calls at different times. Besides, information discussed can be forwarded to those who were not able to make the call.

Going forward, Sherry and I are asking that you continue holding these important calls and if you have not been holding them, please give it a try. We can assure you, they will be informative and fun. We will offer one suggestion: keep them under an hour!

Ride safe; be well. And, as always, remember that fun shall be the last word—so HAVE FUN!
